Many projects and papers will be given during the course of the school year and students may need additional folders for report covers or index cards for research. Some teachers prefer students to take notes in a spiral notebook (for easy study purposes). Teachers require that written assignments be on regular notebook paper—not torn from a spiral notebook.

NOTE: Internet access for research is important. Students cannot depend upon school internet/computers <u>for all projects</u>. Access at home or the ability to get to and use the public library should be available to students. Students should also have access to a printer at home or the library, and should not rely on using the school's copier or printers. Students will be charged \$1.00 per page for printing.
